REGISTRATION FOR 2019-20

Kirksey: February 21 & Elmwood: February 22: You will meet with your Counselor during your Science class. These dates are the LAST DATES to turn in forms.

After the due date, if your form is not turned in, your courses will be selected by your Counselor and you will not be able to change them.

Select 7 classes plus 4 alternates.

If you don't select courses and alternates, Counselors pick your classes.

Many courses require teacher recommendations. Talk to your teachers about recommendations for your core classes.

Students need to pick 7 credits of courses and 4 alternate classes in HAC.

You are responsible for acquiring teacher recommendations prior to meeting with your Counselor.

Be sure that you have selected an English, math, science and social studies course.

If you select a one-semester course, you must pair it with another one-semester course.

SHOULD I TAKE ADVANCED COURSES?

What if you have failed a course in high school?

If you fail a course that is required for graduation, you will need to retake it. Make sure to have a conversation with your high school counselor if you fail a class at anytime during your high school career.

ARE YOU ON TRACK TO GRADUATE?

While RHS does not retain you for lack of credits, you can still end up behind in credits and unable to graduate on time. You need to earn a minimum number of credits each year to be on track to graduate.

- ◆ End of 9th grade - 5.5 credits
- ◆ End of 10th grade - 11 credits
- ◆ End of 11th grade - 16.5 credits

CONCURRENT CREDIT

If interested in taking college classes as a senior, keep your GPA up and do your best on your ACT Aspire and ACT tests. These courses require a minimum GPA and test scores to qualify.

SCHEDULE

Course requests are an extremely important part of staffing the school and building the master schedule. For this reason, Counselors will not be making schedule changes in the fall. All course requests are considered final, and changes will only be considered in cases of Counselor error. Choose wisely as you are committing to the courses that you select. **COURSE SELECTIONS ARE FINAL!!**

WHY CHOOSE ALTERNATES?

Not everyone will get their first choices due to staffing, class loads, and course conflicts. Alternates are your opportunity to tell us your back up choices.

ALTERNATES GET USED!

- Getting an alternate on your schedule is not a mistake.
- You cannot request teachers, class periods, lunches, etc.
- Your 1st & 2nd semesters may not be the same! This is not an error.

TEACHER RECOMMENDATIONS

- *Required for any advanced class.
- *These are based on what is in your best interest, not on your feelings!
- *If you are recommended for an advanced class that you don't want, let your Counselor know.

AA PROGRAM (Junior Year)

The Associate's Program (AA) allows select students to graduate with a high school diploma and an Associate's Degree! Be thinking ahead if this may be right for you!

ACT ASPIRE - You will take the Aspire next year. These test scores can be used later to qualify for college-level programs!

Be mindful of your attendance! Don't allow yourself to lose credit in a course. If attendance becomes a problem, talk to your counselor or your assistant principal.

Can you raise your GPA in a semester? Yes! You need a 2.0 to get your permit. A higher GPA can lead to more opportunities later!

What are you doing after high school? Don't wait until senior year to think about it! Taking elective classes at RHS can help you find fields you like!

PLAN AHEAD

You will have many options for programs in the 11th & 12th grade. RHS students have the opportunity to take off-campus career training in several high-demand fields. Keep your GPA and test scores up so that you can compete for spots in these programs!

AP CAPSTONE DIPLOMA: What is it?

RPS students now have the opportunity to earn a nationally-recognized AP Capstone Diploma in addition to their RPS Diploma. This is a highly advanced program designed to prepare you for college. You will complete a college-level research project! Endorsed by the U of A and many other colleges. Be thinking ahead if this may be something for you starting your junior year!

- ◆ Take 6 AP courses, including AP Seminar and AP Research. You choose the other 4.
- ◆ To earn the diploma, you must earn a 3 or higher on all 6 AP exams.
